<p> KEY DOCUMENTS PUBLISHED</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> POLICING PLAN 2020-25 AND ANNUAL PERFORMANCE PLAN 2020-21 The Policing Plan has been developed in partnership with the PSNI following public consultation and outlines our ambitions for policing in the next five years. It outlines three outcomes for policing: that we have a safe community, we have confidence in policing, and we have engaged and supportive communities. HUMAN RIGHTS ANNUAL REPORT The Report provides an account of the performance of the PSNI in its compliance with the Human Rights Act 1998 (up to the end of March) and an overview of the monitoring work carried out during the year by the Board. It highlights good policing practice and areas in which practice could be improved with specific recommendations. ANNUAL REPORT The Board's Annual Report and Accounts provides an overview of work during the financial year and provides an assessment of Board performance against the Corporate Plan and police performance against the Policing Plan. THEMATIC REVIEW OF USE OF SPIT & BITE GUARDS This report considers all relevant information and provides a human rights assessment of the application of Spit and Bite Guards. It also reviews all the current evidence, safe-guards and protections and makes a number of recommendations in relation to training and guidance.
