February's meeting provided the first opportunity for the Board to discuss with the Chief Constable the implications of the resourcing announcement made by the PSNI, the future policing model now required and the changes and restructuring that may be required as a result of the financial pressures.

Updates were also sought on the Police Pay Award, Misconduct proceedings, the use of Conducted Energy devices, Domestic Abuse, the use of strip search on Under 18's along with updates on a range of recent investigations.

TALKING POLICING AND HUMAN RIGHTS

Delivery of Rights Based Policing is essential for Public Confidence. That was the message as the Board published its 15th Human Rights Annual Report into how the police meet their human rights responsibilities.

At a 'Let's Talk Policing and Human Rights' Event in the Board's offices, the findings from the Report long with a special review examining the **Use of Force** by the Police Service of Northern Ireland (PSNI) were discussed.

Questions on the day were wide ranging covering Biometric Retention, Social Media Use, Stop and Search, police statistics, Intelligence gathering and the Treatment of Suspects.

Following publication of the reports, the Chief Constable will formally respond to the recommendations made.
