### **Request:**

Please provide the current number of retrospective IHR and IOD applications currently awaiting consideration, specifically from officers who have resigned and therefore not currently awarded a pensionable income from the PSNI.

### **Answer:**

There is no provision within the *Police Pensions Regulations (Northern Ireland) 2015* (**the 2015 Regulations**) that permits the making of an application for Ill Health Retirement retrospectively.

The Northern Ireland Policing Board (the **Board**) current holds 57 Retrospective Injury on Duty Applications from officers who have resigned and are therefore not currently awarded a pensionable income from the PSNI.
