## Request:

Please could you provide me with the following:

- 1. From January 2017 until December 2023 the total number of officers who have retired via the ill health retirement process.
- 2. The "Bandings" of the officers who were granted ill health retirement in point 1 and were then subsequently awarded an Injury on Duty Award.

## Answer:

I can confirm that the Board holds information falling within the description specified in your request. However, we estimate that the cost of complying with your request would exceed the appropriate limit. The appropriate limit has been specified in regulations and for the Board it is set at £450. This represents the estimated cost of one person spending 18 hours in determining whether the Board holds the information, and locating, retrieving and extracting the information. Under section 12 of the Freedom of Information Act the Board is not obliged to comply with your request and we will not be processing your request further.

If you narrow the scope of your request, to a 4-year time period (from April 2019 to current date as electronic records exist) or request 24 random sample cases from January 2017- March 2019, as a manual check of the report for each case will be required, the Board may be able to provide the information required because it would cost less than the appropriate limit to do so.
