Answer:

The NI Policing Board (NIPB) procures all goods and services in accordance with the <u>NI Public</u> <u>Procurement Policy</u> adopted by the Northern Ireland Executive in May 2002 (reissued August 2014). In accordance with the section 21 exemption (Information already reasonably accessible) this policy is readily available on the Department of Finance website via the website link above and has not been provided.

When seeking to appoint external consultants the NIPB adheres to additional 'Guidance on the use of professional services' within <u>FD (DoF) 07/12</u>. In accordance with the section 21 exemption (Information already reasonably accessible) this policy is readily available on the Department of Finance website via the website link above and has not been provided.

The only procurement exception is that of external audit which is undertaken by the Comptroller and Auditor General who is appointed under statute.
