# 3 The full breakdown of charges for each job for each role (2017 - 2023) (initial exam, reconsideration, amendments, appeals etc)

# Answer:

The Freedom of Information Act covers any recorded information that is held by a public authority. Having conducted a search of our accounting records it has been established that the Northern Ireland Policing Board (the **Board**) does hold information however, it would require us to re-visit our budget spend, over the years requested. To determine a full breakdown of charges would fall outside the financial limit (Appropriate limit) of this request.

As such section 12 of the Freedom of Information Act (Requests where the cost of compliance exceeds the appropriate limit) applies. The appropriate limit has been specified in regulations and for the Board it is set at £450. This represents the estimated cost of one person spending 18 hours in determining whether the Board holds the information, and locating, retrieving and extracting the information.

Any reformulated request the Board receives from you will be treated as a fresh FOI request.
