Funded Projects

1. Introduction

On 17 February 2022, applications opened for the second Call of the Police Property Fund Small Grants Scheme. The Fund is made up of assets recovered by the Police Service of Northern Ireland (PSNI) as a result of criminal investigations, and the Board agreed that grants would be awarded to charitable aligned projects that demonstrated engagement with the PSNI, contributed to community safety/ and or building confidence in policing.

The Scheme was designed by the Board to support project ideas that will improve safety in local areas, and support partnership building and relationships with policing and within the community.

Following assessment against the eligibility criteria, a number of projects were offered and accepted awards in line with the Board's procedures for Grant Awards. Just over £120,000 has been funded from the second funding call to 15 projects across Northern Ireland. Details of the awards and projects are contained in Section 2.

Ards Academy FC	Ards Academy Community Youth Project	Project will provide 210 coaching and education sessions to 300 primary school aged children as an after-schools outreach in the Newtownards area. Project will aim to support the local PSNI in preventing anti-social behaviour (ASB) which has notably been on the increase over recent years.	£10,000
Ballycraigy Primary School PTA	Help Out Afterschool	Project aims to create a supportive programme which will provide a safe place after school for children. They will have opportunity to develop life skills and contribute to the local community. Projects main aims are to reduce anti-social behaviour, to build confidence in the police and improve the local environment.	£4,000
Bardic Educational Arts & Media (BEAM)	Cyber Safe	Project aims to deliver 40 internet safety workshops to primary schools around Mid Ulster with the assistance from the local PSNI officers. Project will also provide schools with a cyber safe resource pack which will give teachers different strategies using arts-based methods to engage children to explore issues surrounding cyber safety.	£7,670
Belfast Exposed Photography	Our City	This project will engage with 20 young people aged 16-18 years from the Shankill and Ballygomartin areas of Belfast through creative photography workshops enabling young people to a have their voice heard through images, rather than conflict. The young people will engage with the PSNI through a visit to the local PSNI station and through ongoing engagement in the project.	£9,585
Cranagh and Aghagallon Club	Healthier and Safer Aghagallon	Project aims to hold information, education and training sessions on a range of crime prevention methods. These will be delivered by the local Neighbourhood Policing Team who have been involved in the development of the project and will contribute to outcome 1 of the NI Policing Plan - We have a safe community. The project also plans to provide IT introduction courses and hold health awareness sessions on various forms of cancer, dementia and autism awareness.	£7,114

Culmore Community Partnership	Culmore Community Safety Programme	Project wants to run a Summer Scheme for the Intermediate Youth Club (age 9-13yrs) from 18th - 22nd July and Junior Youth Club (age 7-8yrs) from 25th-29th July 2022. Wants to provide a range of learning opportunities, skills development and fun activities for local kids while also engaging with the PSNI to help deliver key elements of the programme including road safety awareness, bicycle security tagging, water safety and online.	£10,000
ForthSpring Inter- Community Group	Building Bridges Project	Project aims to engage with young people age 8 to 18 in the Woodvale/Shankill and Springfield/Clonard areas around ASB, Community relations and attitudes towards police. Firstly at a street level via detached work 2 nights per week the project would focus on those who are currently disengaged and at the highest risk of becoming involved in ASB. Once a relationship has been formed project staff would be engaging in group work activities which will foster cross community connections, explore community safety and citizenship and building a better relationship with the police.	£9,996
Habinteg Housing Association	Habinteg Housing Youth Intervention Programme	Project includes two main elements, one will engage 35 children aged 7-10 years in a programme of activities between June 2022-March 2023. Young people who are at risk of engaging in ASB due to poor family support, low income families or poor access to diversionary activities will be targeted. The projects will involve workshops, social activities and training. The second element of the programme will engage 35 teenagers aged 11-18 year olds in diversionary activities including social activities, workshops and training.	£9,801
Listening Ear	Listening Ear	Listening Ear seeks to deliver support and assist the community addressing social issues such as mental health, suicide prevention and drug and alcohol abuse. The aim is to have a free weekly service access to a trained mental health counsellor. Sessions will include outreach trips and guest speakers to discuss different subject matters. The aim is to target 10 individuals and support their recovery.	£10,000

Melmount Community Forum	Building Respectful and Safe Communities	Project will develop a programme in the local area with young people that aims to train them up to be community champions. Workshops in partnership with the PSNI and other agencies will deliver much needed education to the negative impact of anti-social behaviour. First aid, water safety, personal development as well as mental health and online safety will be one of many workshops that will be explored.	£7,436
Mid & East Antrim . Agewell Partnership	SCAMMED	This project will inform write and perform a theatre piece highlighting the impact of scams on older people. The final piece will be performed at the Braid Arts Centre before going on tour around local communities for 8 older people community groups.	£8,900
North Down Cricket Club	Sport for Good	Project aims to work with youths from the Ards, Comber and Ballygowan areas focusing on housing estates. The project seeks to deliver workshops and coaching sessions to 250 participants with the goal of contributing to community safety and tackling ASB as well as increasing confidence in policing through the medium of engaged sporting activity.	£9,000
Road Safe NI	Children Road Safety Educational Videos	RoadSafeNI's aim is to develop a library of high quality educational resources that can be utilised by our charity, schools, colleges, the PSNI, PCSPs, NIFRS, community groups and other agencies across the 3 sectors that promote road safety education. The grant would be used to develop 4 highly impactful, educational videos that will be presented during road safety talks/lessons to children and young people by RoadSafeNI and other agencies across the three sectors.	£10,000
Strathfoyle Community Association	50th Anniversary Fun Day	Project intends to hold a fun day to celebrate their 50th year of helping the local community. At the fun day residents will be able to gather together and enjoy each other's company and cut down on social isolation in a rural community. Throughout the fun day the PSNI will be encouraged to interact with the community and will be highly visible.	£2,590

The Y Zone	The Youth Hut Initiative	Project aims to create a leadership/mentoring programme for young citizenship whilst working alongside the local PSNI, council and PCSP. Workshops such as the graffiti art project and outdoor kitchen space will help deliver life skills and promote culture and arts. Sessions will be delivered on drugs and alcohol awareness to help combat ASB and low level crime in local area and promote healthy and independent lives in young people	£6,000
