For clarity, this request relates only to road vehicles used by the Northern Ireland Policing Board. It does not include vehicles operated by the Police Service of Northern Ireland unless they are owned, leased, or operated specifically on behalf of the Board.

If possible, please provide this information in a spreadsheet or table format, such as Excel or CSV.

If the Northern Ireland Policing Board does not currently own, lease or operate any road vehicles, please confirm this.

If any part of this request is considered exempt from disclosure, I would be grateful if you could provide the remaining information and explain the reasons for any exemptions applied.

If you require any clarification regarding this request, please do not hesitate to contact me. I look forward to your response within 20 working days as required by the Freedom of Information Act 2000.
