



Annual Custody Visitors Statistics 2015/2016

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Summary

Please note:

- Bangor closed from 13 April to 3 August 2015.
- Antrim closed in September 2015 for approximately 6 months. The Serious Crime Suite moving permanently from Antrim to Musgrave when this occurred.
- Banbridge closed since 13 April 2015. Armagh now operational.
- Strand Road closed 7-11 December 2015.

Satisfactory/Unsatisfactory visits (pages 2 to 4)

- There were a total of 483 visits made between April 2015 to March 2016.
- 15 visits were not completed, thus there were 468 valid visits.
- Based on the valid visits the Tyrone/Fermanagh team recorded the highest level of satisfaction (92%).
- 57 visits were classified as unsatisfactory (12%) and 411 visits were classified as satisfactory (88%).
- 16% of the visits by the South East team were recorded as unsatisfactory.
- The main reason for unsatisfactory visits was faulty equipment (27).

Visits made (pages 5 to 6)

- Almost a fifth of visits were made on Wednesdays (92, 19%).
- Over two in five visits were made between 6 p.m. and 9 p.m. (222, 46%).
- Eleven visits (2%) were carried out between 12 o'clock and 9 a.m.
- Visits ranged from 4 to 80 minutes.
- The average length of time spent on each visit was 26 minutes.

Detainees (pages 7 to 9)

- Of the 937 detainees held during this period, Custody Visitors saw 450, 61 detainees refused to be seen and 426 were not seen for other reasons.
- The most common reasons for detainees not being seen were being asleep (236) and being interviewed (81).
- The overall refusal rate for April 2015 to March 2016 was 7% (61 refused).
- There were a total of 685 (73%) custody records checked by Custody Visitors.

Delays (page 9)

 There were 13 occasions when Custody Visitors were delayed for more than ten minutes.

Antrim and Musgrave Serious Crime Suites (page 10)

- 9 visits were made to Antrim Serious Crime Suite during which time 8 detainees were held. Three detainees were seen and 5 refused to be seen. Antrim Serious Crime Suite moved permanently in September 2015 from Antrim to Musgrave.
- 9 visits were made to Musgrave Serious Crime Suite from October 2015 to March 2016. Of the 5 unannounced visits, 6 detainees were held. Five detainees were seen, none refused to be seen and one detainee was not seen for other reasons. Of the 4 announced visits, 9 detainees were held. One detainee was seen, 5 refused to be seen and 3 detainees were not seen for other reasons.

Part One – Monitoring the treatment of detainees in line with PACE, Human rights provisions and Code of Ethics

Satisfactory/Unsatisfactory visits

Custody Visitors made 483 visits during April 2015 to March 2016, 33% less than the number of visits carried out in January to March 2015 (726). Of these, 15 visits were not carried out (see Table 2) and were deemed to be invalid.

Custody Visitors classified 411 out of the 468 valid visits (88%) as satisfactory. The Tyrone/Fermanagh team recorded the highest level of satisfaction (92%). The highest level of unsatisfactory visits (16%) was recorded by the South East team.

Part Two - Monitoring the effectiveness of the scheme

Visits made

Custody Visitors made 483 visits during April 2015 to March 2016, 243 less than in April 2014 to March 2015 (726).

Table 6 shows the number of visits made to each station during April 2015 to March 2016. Active stations for which the monthly target number of visits were not equalled or exceeded are indicated in italics, as are those teams that did not equal or exceed the monthly target number of visits for all stations in their area.

Of the 483 visits, almost a fifth was carried out on Wednesdays (92, 19%). The least amount of visits was carried out on Mondays (56, 12%).

Almost nine in ten of all visits (430, 89%) were made in the 12 hour period between 9 a.m. to 9 p.m.

Over two in five of all visits (222, 46%) were carried out between 6 p.m. and 9 p.m. Eleven visits (2%) were carried out between 12 o'clock and 9 a.m. and these were carried out by the South East (5) and Tyrone/Fermanagh (6) teams.

The shortest visit took 4 minutes while the longest visit took 80 minutes. The average length of a Custody Visit was 26 minutes.

^{*}There is a requirement for 10% of custody visits to be undertaken during unsociable hours. To avoid disturbing detainees during their 8 hour rest period (PACE requirement) the ICV will view them through the cell door hatch.

Detainees seen by Custody Visitors

There were 937 detainees held at the time of these visits, of which visitors saw 450, 61 detainees refused to be seen, and 426 detainees were not seen for other reasons.

Refusal rates

Table 11 shows the refusal rate by custody suite (calculated as the number of detainees who refused to be seen as a percentage of the number that were held in custody at the time of the visit).

The overall refusal rate for April 2015 to March 2016 was 7%, an increase when compared with April 2014 to March 2015 (5%: 1,216 held, 65 refused).

The refusal rate was lowest in the Tyrone/Fermanagh team (1%, 89 held, 1 refused). The highest refusal rate was in the North-West team (9%, 274 held, 25 refused).

Custody records checked

There were a total of 685 custody records checked by visitors. This means that the Custody Visitors checked the custody records of just fewer than three in four detainees who were held (73%).

Antrim Serious Crime Suite and Musgrave Serious Crime Suite

During April 2015 to September 2015, 9 visits were made to Antrim Serious Crime Suite during which time 8 detainees were held. Three detainees were seen and 5 refused to be seen. Antrim Serious Crime Suite moved permanently in October 2015 from Antrim to Musgrave.

9 visits were made to Musgrave Serious Crime Suite from October 2015 to March 2016, 4 of which were announced. Of the 5 unannounced visits, 6 detainees were held. Five detainees were seen, none refused to be seen and one detainee was not seen for other reasons. Of the 4 announced visits, 9 detainees were held. One detainee was seen, 5 refused to be seen and 3 detainees was not seen for other reasons.
