



# Annual Custody Visitors Statistics 2016/2017

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#### Summary

#### Please note:

- Lurgan closed between August 2016 and May 2017
- Musgrave SCS There is a current reduction in ground floor capacity by 10 cells.
- •Bangor closed as of 5 December 2016. It will be available as a contingency suite for Musgrave and other planned works in the South East.
- •Antrim Ground floor reopened on 5 December 2016. First floor is scheduled to be completed in January.
- Armagh temporary contingency reopening
- •Enniskillen Two cells are currently closed. Planned works are planned to commence in May 2017 December 2017, with all 8 cells reopening. Works beginning will coincide with Lurgan re-opening.
- Dungannon Planned works are currently on hold.
- •Strabane reopened in March 2017

#### Satisfactory/Unsatisfactory visits (pages 3 to 6)

- There were a total of 661 visits made between April 2016 to March 2017.
- 28 visits were not completed, thus there were 633 valid visits.
- Based on the valid visits the Tyrone/Fermanagh team recorded the highest level of satisfaction (90%).
- 85 visits were classified as unsatisfactory (13%) and 548 visits were classified as satisfactory (87%).
- 19% of the visits by the South East team were recorded as unsatisfactory.
- The main reason for unsatisfactory visits was sanitation (26).

#### Visits made (pages 6 to 7)

- Almost a fifth of visits were made on Saturdays (129, 20%).
- More than two in five visits were made between 6 p.m. and 9 p.m. (222, 41%).
- 27 visits (4%) were carried out between 12 o'clock and 9 a.m.
- Visits ranged from less than a minute to 135 minutes.
- The average length of time spent on each visit was 25 minutes.

#### **Detainees** (pages 8 to 9)

- Of the 1180 detainees held during this period, Custody Visitors saw 517, 68 detainees refused to be seen and 595 were not seen for other reasons.
- The most common reasons for detainees not being seen were being asleep (319) and being interviewed (121).
- The overall refusal rate for April 2016 to March 2017 was 6% (68 refused).
- There were a total of 831 (70%) custody records checked by Custody Visitors.

#### **Delays** (pages 10 and 11)

 There were 19 occasions when Custody Visitors were delayed for more than ten minutes.

#### **Musgrave Serious Crime** (page 12)

 During the period April 2016 to March 2017, 32 valid visits were made to Musgrave Serious Crime Suite, 12 of which were announced. From the 20 unannounced visits, 27 detainees were held. Seven detainees were seen, seven refused to be seen and 13 detainees were not seen for other reasons. From the 12 announced visits, 28 detainees were held. Five detainees were seen, 11 refused to be seen and 12 detainees were not seen for other reasons.

## Part One – Monitoring the treatment of detainees in line with PACE, Human Rights provisions and Code of Ethics

#### Satisfactory/Unsatisfactory visits

Custody Visitors made 661 visits during April 2016 to March 2017, 27% more than the number of visits carried out in January to March 2016 (483). Of these, 28 visits were not completed (Table 2) and were deemed invalid, hence there were 633 valid visits.

Custody Visitors classified 548 out of the 633 valid visits (83%) as satisfactory. The Tyrone/Fermanagh team recorded the highest level of satisfaction (90%). The highest rate of unsatisfactory visits (18%) was recorded by the South East team.

#### Part Two - Monitoring the effectiveness of the scheme

#### Visits made

Custody Visitors made 661 visits during the period April 2016 to March 2017, 178 more than in the period April 2015 to March 2016 (483).

A comparison of the number of visits made to each station during January to March 2017, with the number of guideline visits in provided at Table 6. Active stations for which the monthly number of guideline visits was not met are indicated in italics, as are those teams that did not meet the monthly target number of visits for all stations in their area.

A large majority of visits (90%, 607 visits) were made in the 12 hour period between 9 a.m. to 9 p.m.

41% of all visits (270 visits) were carried out between 6 p.m. and 9 p.m. 27 visits (4%) were carried out between midnight and 9 a.m.

The shortest visit took less than one minute, while the longest visit took 135 minutes. The average length of a Custody Visit in 2016-17 was 25 minutes.

There were 1180 detainees held at the time of these visits, of which visitors saw 517, 68 detainees refused to be seen, and 595 detainees were not seen for other reasons.

#### Refusal rates

Table 11 shows the refusal rate by custody suite (calculated as the number of detainees who refused to be seen as a percentage of the number that were held in custody at the time of the visit).

The overall refusal rate for April 2016 to March 2017 was 6%, a decrease when compared with April 2015 to March 2016 (7%: 937 held, 61 refused).

The refusal rate was lowest for the North-West team (5%, 356 held, 19 refused). The South East and Tyrone/Fermanagh teams matched the overall refusal rate of 6%.
