Request:

1. What were the total fees paid to Dr Hamilton (SMP) for the period 1 April 2019 to 31 March 2020?
2. What were the total expenses paid to Dr Hamilton (SMP) for the period 1 April 2019 to 31 March 2020?
3. What were the total fees paid to Dr Humphries (SMP) for the period 1 April 2019 to 31 March 2020?
4. What were the total expenses paid to Dr Humphries (SMP) for the period 1 April 2019 to 31 March 2020?
5. What were the total fees paid to Dr Adejoro (SMP) for the period 1 April 2019 to 31 March 2020?
6. What were the total expenses paid to Dr Adejoro (SMP) for the period 1 April 2019 to 31 March 2020?

Answer to questions 1, 3 and 5:

I can confirm that the Northern Ireland Policing Board holds information which falls within the scope of your request. However we are withholding information in respect of fees paid to individual doctors in their role as Selected Medical Practitioners (SMP's) as it is deemed to be the personal data of a third party. This personal information is exempt from disclosure to you under section 40(2) by virtue of section 40(3)(a)(i) of the FOIA.

Section 40(2) allows a public authority to withhold information from a response to a request for information under the FOIA when the information requested is personal information relating to someone other than the requester and its disclosure would contravene one of the data protection principles.

The first data protection principle requires personal data to be processed fairly and lawfully. This personal data is exempt from disclosure under section 40(2) of the FOIA as, in our view, it would be unfair to provide it to you, and therefore disclosure would be

in contravention of the first principle of the UK General Data Protection Regulation. This is an absolute exemption and there is no requirement to conduct a public interest test.

By way of assistance the Board can confirm that during the financial year 2019/20 a total of £154,290 was paid across all of the SMPs.

Answer to questions 2, 4 and 6:

The Board did not pay expenses for any of its SMPs in the financial year 2019/20.
