FEBRUARY ACCOUNTABILITY SESSION

At the first Board accountability session of 2022, discussions centred on a range of issues including the budget settlement for policing and the potential impact on service delivery, neighbourhood policing and recruitment. Questions were also raised on the development of the PSNI Violence against Women and Girls Strategy, reporting of Domestic Abuse, the processing of Firearms licences, sequencing of legacy investigations, professional standards, analysis of PSNI arrest and charge rates and the use of Public Interest Immunity Certificates.

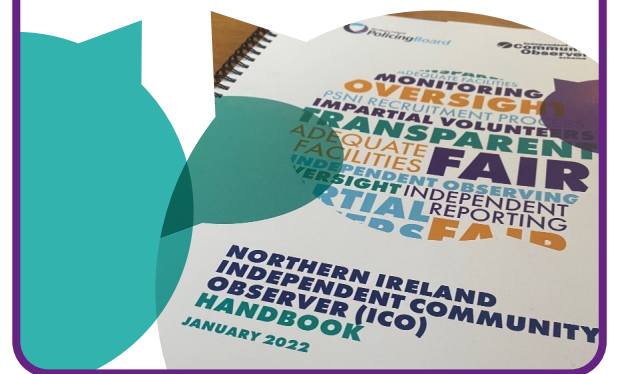
New Funding Call
